Five key ingredients

Strong communication skills Good listening & observation skills

Strong analytical mind

Enjoy working with people

Be passionate (with a helping heart)



Five key ingredients

1. Strong communication skills

- With patients, family members and other professions.
- Build good rapport.
- Present assessment results.
- Teach therapeutic tasks.









Five key ingredients (cont.)

2. Good listening & observation skills

- Be sensitive to patient's needs.
- Be sensitive to note subtle differences.

3. Strong analytical mind

- We work as a detective.
- Examine, observe, get hints, set hypothesis.
- Test your hypothesis during on-going treatment.
- Revise your hypothesis, whenever necessary.



Five key ingredients (cont.)

4. Enjoy working with people

- Be a good team player.
- Patients, caretakers, teachers, medical doctors, nurses, physiotherapists, social workers, occupational therapists, etc.



5. Be passionate (with a helping heart)

- Serves as the foundation for other ingredients.
- Motivates you to do better.



How do we prepare our students?

Strong theoretical knowledge

 Reinforce your theoretical knowledge across years through spiral learning.

Clinical practicum

- 300 hours of direct clinical contact, working with clients with communication and swallowing disorders.
- Simulation clinic.





How do we prepare our students? (cont.)

Experiential learning

- Events (e.g., Green Voice Day, World Swallowing Day).
- Embedded in coursework.
- Visits at external organisations, clinics and schools.
- Wuhan clinic experience.















How do we prepare our students? (cont.)

Research opportunities

- Final year research project in year 5 (Capstone).
- Research laboratories.
- University-level research fellowships
 (Laidlaw Undergraduate Research & Leadership Programme,
 University Research Fellowship Programme).









Admissions Tips

Application:

- Only consider applicants who put our programme in their Band A choices.
- Include a personal statement in the application.

At the interview:

- Show us your passion toward the programme. (Voluntary work, shadowing experiences can be an advantage but not compulsory.)
- Clear understanding about the curriculum.



Admissions scores (2021 intake)

- Best 6 subjects (English: Level 4 or above)
 Note: Biology NOT compulsory subject.
- All subjects are counted equally.
- Median 38 (2021 JUPAS Admissions).
- Expected Score 34.


Conversion of levels into scores:

5**=8.5, 5*=7, 5=5.5, 4=4, 3=3, 2=2, 1=1, others=0.
