Master of Science in Audiology [MSc(Audiology)]

Applications are invited for admission in September 2026 to the Master of Science in Audiology programme. The curriculum shall extend over two academic years of full-time study.

Programme aim

The Master of Science in Audiology is a professional programme which provides students with detailed theoretical background knowledge of human hearing and hearing loss, intensive clinical practice in a variety of audiology placements, as well as an appreciation of research in audiology.

Admissions requirements

To be eligible for admission to the programme, candidates shall satisfy both the University Admissions Requirements and the Programme Specific Requirements as listed below:

1. comply with the [General Regulations](#) and the [Regulations for Taught Postgraduate Curricula](#);
2. hold a Bachelor's degree preferably with a major in education, psychology, linguistics, physics, medicine, physics, speech and hearing sciences or other subjects relevant to this multidisciplinary profession from this University or another comparable institution;
3. for a candidate who is seeking admission on the basis of a qualification from a university or comparable institution outside Hong Kong where the language of teaching and/or examination is not English, shall satisfy the University English language requirement applicable to higher degrees as prescribed under General Regulation G2(b) having:
 - a) a score of 80 or above (internet-based test) in the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL)[#]; or
 - b) a minimum overall band of 6 with no sub-test lower than 5.5 in the International English Language Testing System (IELTS)[#]; or
 - c) grade C or above in either the Overseas General Certificate of Education, the International General Certificate of Secondary Education, or the Cambridge Test of Proficiency in English Language
4. satisfy the examiners in a qualifying examination, if required.

Applications for exemption from the above requirements shall be considered on a case-by-case basis.

IELTS and TOEFL tests must be taken within two years prior to September 1 of each admissions year. TOEFL Home Edition or IELTS Online are not accepted.

Application

Applications should be submitted online at <https://admissions.hku.hk/tpg/> by **12:00 noon (GMT+8), April 2, 2026 (Thursday)**.

After submission of an online application, you are required to **upload the supporting documents** by logging on to <https://sweb.hku.hk/tola/servlet/CreateUserScreen/loginForm> by the application deadline or within four weeks from the date of creation of your account, whichever is earlier. Posting of documents is NOT required at the application stage. Please refer to the “**Instructions for Submitting Supporting Documents**” for details. Should an applicant be considered for admission, he/she will receive an email notification from the Programme Office to submit the required documents. Please note that our request to submit documents does not necessarily mean that you will receive an offer of admission.

Interview

Shortlisted applicants may be invited to attend an interview scheduled for **April 17 (Friday), April 18 (Saturday), April 24 (Friday) or April 25 (Saturday), 2026**. However, being invited to an interview is not an indicator of the chance of admission.

Successful applicants will be informed of their admission results by email, and will receive an Offer of Admission letter enclosing a Notice of Admission statement after verification of academic qualifications.
