3-4 Elective Courses (with a total of at least 72 hours)

### **Confirmation of candidature**

By the end of the probationary period, which should normally not exceed 24 months for part-time candidates and 18 months for full-time candidates, candidates must have

- i. completed the 4 core courses;
- ii. completed the two courses offered by the Graduate School;
- iii. completed the first three chapters (i.e. Introduction, Literature Review, and Research Methods) of the doctoral thesis to the satisfaction of the Supervisory Panel;
- iv. obtained ethical approval; and
- v. presented a confirmation seminar.

Candidates are required to write a thesis of 50,000 to 60,000 words and are expected to attend seminars and present research reports regularly after confirmation of candidature.

## Core courses



#### Research Methods I & II

 introduce educational research methods with particular emphasis on critical reading and understanding of a variety of approaches to research in education

### **Thesis Writing Workshop**

 develops students' systematic knowledge of how to write about their research and apply such knowledge to their writing both within and beyond the course

#### **Issues in Education**

 focuses on a range of contemporary issues in education affecting learners and educators

Classes are normally scheduled in evenings during weekdays, and/or Saturday mornings or afternoons.

## **Graduate School courses**



### **Responsible Conduct of Research**

- equips students with essential vocabulary, principles, and practices conducive to the promotion of responsible conduct of research in general and in their relevant disciplines
- students are expected to attend this module before taking the Streambased Responsible Conduct of Research

### **Stream-based Responsible Conduct of Research**

- addresses responsible conduct of research in a number of topics germane to different disciplines
- students are required to choose to take one 3-hour workshop
- complete a reflective report of about 500 words

## Research support for EdD students

- Consultation on research methods by designated staff members

## Admission requirements



### **General entrance requirement**

Applicants should (1) hold a Bachelor's degree with second class honours and a taught Master's degree; or a Bachelor's degree with first class honours; and (2) demonstrate a record of at least 4 years of professional experience in an educational institution or services in the education sector or other relevant sectors as judged appropriate by the Faculty. Applicants who do not meet the above requirements will be considered on their own merits.

### **English Language Proficiency Test**

- An applicant who is seeking admission on the basis of a qualification from a university or comparable institution outside Hong Kong of which the language of teaching and/or examination is not English is required to provide score report of English proficiency test.

  - Statement of Proposed Area of Professional Inquiry; and

## How to prepare for your application (4A): Short proposal



4. Write a short statement of proposed area of professional inquiry in English (Guided Length: between 2,500 to 4,000 words)

Before writing, ask yourself 5 basic questions:

- a. Is the problem I propose to address meaningful and significant?
- b. What will be the contribution of my thesis to the knowledge, understanding and improvement of practice?
- c. Is it related to the <u>needs and interests</u> of myself and/or my workplace situation?
- d. Is my proposed research feasible in terms of scope and timeframe?
- e. What are the expected end results?

## How to prepare for your application (4F): Declaration



Each applicant has to include a declaration in his/her Statement of Proposed Area of Professional Inquiry to confirm whether the proposal:

- (i) is all his/her <u>original work</u>; names of <u>persons who have provided</u> <u>contribution and the nature and extent of their contribution</u> should be specified if otherwise; and
- (ii) in whole or in part, has not been published and/or submitted to any institution; the extent and the details of the publication and/or submission to the institution(s) should be specified if otherwise

## How to prepare for your application (4G): Academic help



You are strongly encouraged to contact a potential supervisor and seek advice on preparing the Statement of Proposed Area of Professional Inquiry.

## Important Note to Applicants (on application)



- ➤ Before submitting an application, you are strongly encouraged to seek a potential supervisor's advice on preparing the Statement of Proposed Area of Professional Inquiry.
- ➤ The name of your proposed supervisor must be specified in the online application form.
- Successful applicants will commence their studies in September 2025.

## Important Note to Applicants (on student registration)



- According to the EdD Regulations, a person may register as a <u>full-time</u> student when he or she holds
  - no employment; or
  - part-time employment (whether inside or outside the University), provided that the employment entails not more than 150 hours of work per annum; or
  - a University research assistantship, provided that the work undertaken in this capacity is focused on the topic of the holder's research degree study; or
  - employment but leave of absence has been granted by the employer.

## Important Note to Applicants (on student registration)



- As part of the student registration procedures, students are required to present valid identity documents, and other relevant documents as requested, to the Faculty Office for verification.
- For non-local students, they are required to present a valid visa and landing slip to the Faculty Office for verification of their eligibility for studying in Hong Kong.

## Important Note to Applicants (on course attendance)



- ➤ The EdD programme is NOT a distance learning programme. Students are required to come to HKU campus for their studies when the University runs classes in face-to-face mode.
- Courses have attendance requirements. Students who do not attend classes in person on campus (when the University runs classes in F2F mode) will be deemed to fail the course.
- Non-local students who have no plan at all to stay in Hong Kong on a fulltime basis should consider applying to other suitable programmes.

## Composition fees [For reference based on 2024-25 intake]



Part-time: \$94,200 per year (Years 1-6)

- Can you <u>balance</u> your life in the coming 4-6 years (among work, study, family, personal & social life, etc)?
- Can you get support from your family members?
- Can you get support from your workplace (such as school, or institute)?
- How much can you <u>commit</u> to your EdD study (time, efforts, determination...)?

- Take initiative to keep in touch with your supervisors via various means on a regular basis
- Attend seminars given by in-house specialists and/or international scholars
- Participate in formal/informal gatherings with staff and students
